Proposed Jurisdictional Approach for Sustainable Landscapes



Aceh-North Sumatera, Indonesia


- Leuser National Park and Rawa Singkil Wildlife Reserve
- Sustainable Landscape Coalition
- Same province as UOI refinery
- Location of PTPN I, II, III, IV palm oil mills
- Districts of Aceh S, Aceh T, Tapanuli Selatan

Central Kalimantan, Indonesia

- Pilot on jurisdictional approach toward RSPO certification
- Location of Tanjung Puting National Park
- Supporting ISHF RSPO certification (1,000 ISHF targeted this year)
- Focusing in the districts of Seruyan and Kobar

Sabah, Malaysia

- Jurisdictional certification program and approved land-use plan
- Ecological corridors and riparian vegetation are managed
- Commitments of 100% certified palm oil by 2025
- Focusing in Sugut and Tawau



Riau, Indonesia



- Location of most concentration of high risk mills in supply chain (deforestation, peat, national park)
- Tesso Nilo National Park (WWF campaigns)
- Engagement directly with local governments and mills
- District of Siak and Pelalawan Action Plan on Sustainable Palm Oil

Inobu jurisdictional approach for SHF

At the UNFCCC COP 21 in Paris, Unilever announced its support towards **Jurisdictional Approaches (JA)** towards certification. The Inobu project aims at piloting this concept.


- Inobu and Unilever has RSPO and ISPO certified the 190 smallholder farmers in 2017.
- Next steps: Inobu to RSPO and ISPO certify at least 400 additional smallholder farmers
- 5,000 SHF for 3 year project







Sabah Landscape

Focus on Tawau and Sugut objectives

- Integrated land-use plans allow certification of RSPO/NDPE palm oil at landscape level in Sugut and Tawau
- Oil palm growers in Tawau and Sugut are RSPO certified and NDPE compliant through a landscape approach
- Key ecological corridors and riparian vegetation are managed and restored in 2 labung landscapes
